For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have."

This morning as our ushers come forward for our morning offering let's remember it is not so much the amount given that matters but our willingness to give according to our means. May our gift be given today in the same spirit of that young cheerleader.
