

Americans Are Richer But Less Generous

A recent study revealed that from 1968 to the present American's personal incomes rose by 137% while their giving declined by 28%! So, we have more money yet we are giving less to the Church. Now Americans give just a fraction above 2% of their disposable incomes to the Church. The worst year of The Great Depression in 1933 Americans gave 3.2% of their incomes to the Church!

What does this decline mean? It means that billions of dollars every year are lost that could have gone to further the Gospel. The study revealed that if Americans gave at the same rate today as they did in 1968 that the Church would have over \$8 billion more dollars this year to do missions and ministry.

Having \$77,000, including the value of your house puts you in the top 10% globally. A 2012 study showed that an annual income of \$34K placed you in the richest 1% of people in the world!
